


 C-17 Canal (Earman River) flows directly into the Lake Worth Lagoon.

East of the canal, two significant things are planned:

- 1. Seacoast Utilities wants to lease some of the land they own here.
- 2. Congress Avenue is scheduled to be extended north from here.





- Seacoast Utilities owns 14.07 acres at this location. They are presently seeking proposals to lease approximately 9 of those acres.





The City of Palm Beach Gardens owns 6.12 acres at this location. It will be bisected by the Congress Avenue extension to the north.





This 23.16 acre site is owned privately by Hilltop Residential, LLC. It also will be bisected by the Congress Avenue extension to the north.





The Congress Avenue extension to the north is presently proposed to follow this route.






This is the 9-acres Seacoast is seeking to lease. We would like to see it used to create the "Spoonbill STA".

**Proposed Congress Avenue extension** 






 Approximately 1-acre of the Palm Beach Gardens parcel could expand it to a 10-acre STA.

 Additionally, if the Hilltop developer could be incentivized (through increased development rights) to donate approximately 6-acres along the canal, the STA grows to a total of 16-acres.

The Hilltop piece also creates the potential for public access to the STA through the Lake Catherine Sports Complex and/or Howell Watkins Middle School.





Proposed Congress Avenue extension

The remaining 17-acres of the Hilltop Parcel could be rezoned for increased density along Congress Avenue in exchange for the 6-acre donation to the STA project.






 The remaining 5-acres owned by Palm Beach Gardens would be a welcome addition to the STA, or used for another public purpose.

Similar to Green Cay STA in Boynton Beach, there are numerous environmental benefits to creating Spoonbill STA:

- Increases storm water storage capacity
- Water polishing and well field recharging
- Cleans C-17 water before entering the Earman River and Lake Worth Lagoon
- Mitigation credits for future development
- Provides a wildlife corridor helping connect other natural areas to the west (Grassy Waters) and east (MacArthur Beach State Park)
- Public recreational opportunities
- Howell Watkins Living Laboratory
- Great example of environmental sensitivity
